E2007 - AEGROTAT GRADE

PROCEDURES

- 1. The application for an aegrotat grade must be submitted to Registrar and Enrolment Services no later than the day after the last day of the final exams for the semester in question.
- 2. If the student is able to complete the course work by the last working day of the first month of the next semester, a deferred standing request must be submitted and the aegrotat grade request should be withdrawn.
- 3. An application for an aegrotat grade will be submitted to Registrar and Enrolment Services by completing the appropriate form, available through Registrar and Enrolment Services. This form should be accompanied by:
 - a. Documentation from an appropriate listed professional explaining the permanent disability or the incapacity of a catastrophic nature which prevents the student from completing course requirements before the last working day of the first month of the next semester.
 - b. A letter from the student (or legal power of attorney) explaining how the student meets the requirements for an aegrotat grade as set out in 3.3, and why the student was unable to complete course requirements.
 - c. If the documentation is not available at the time the form is submitted, it should be provided as soon as possible following the submission.
- 4. Within 10 working days from receipt of the complete request package at Registrar and Enrolment Services:
 - a. The Registrar (or designate) will determine if the student has submitted appropriate documentation for an aegrotat grade. If appropriate documentation has been submitted, the Registrar (or designate) will inform the appropriate faculty member (or designated alternate).
 - b. The faculty member (or designated alternate) will review the request and decide if the student meets the requirements set out in 3.3. The faculty member (or designated alternate) will then inform Registrar and Enrolment Services of the department assessment.
 - c. The Registrar (or designate) will inform the student of the decision in writing.

Appropriate Listed Professionals:

An appropriate listed professional is an Indigenous Elder, a physician, dentist, clinical psychologist, or nurse practitioner who is currently registered with their professional college as listed in the *Health Professions Act*; or an equivalent registered professional from elsewhere in Canada. If the student is residing outside of Canada, the appropriate professional must be registered with that country's regulatory body for their profession.
